Allied Healthcare Diversity Act - Passed

- ✤ 7 states needed for 2025 legislative session
- Must be identical for all 7 states
- Commission will issue compact licenses after 7 states have passed into law
- Needs to be prioritized by states

RRT TO ENTRY Key Points

- Add hiring leaders, educators, medical directors to discussions
- Include CoARC programs to the discussions
- Student licensure does not affect states who have student/limited license
- Include hospital associations in discussions
- > Only 6 points on Therapist Multiple Choice exam between CRT and RRT credential
- Changing requirement to RRT minimum can be done without opening license
- Can grandfather in current CRT for all licensed therapists
- Lobbyist is an important role in this transition
- Start with Data! Survey your hospitals how many already require RRT within 6-12 months of hire Look at local RRT pass rates
- Compact Licensure coming will help alleviate travelers who are CRT If not already working on this - start now! All states need to get on board with changing requirement to eliminate CRT exam in the future
- NBRC can quickly change TMC to RRT level only once all Affiliates have licensure change

Emergency Resolution

RRT Minimum Licensure Resources:

Resolve the AARC to compile a quick resource page on the website to assist the state affiliates with changing minimum credential requirement to RRT for state licensure

(1) a listing of language used to change licensure to RRT minimum that has been successful in other states.

- Article III Membership
- Section 7 Specialty Sections
- Section 8 Payment of Dues
- Article V Board of Directors
 - Section 1a. Composition and Powers
- ► Article VII; Sec. 3.c 1-5
- Article X Chartered Affiliates
 - Section 1. Requirements
- Section 3. Medical Advisor
- ► Article XII Committees
 - Section 2.a.1.

Article III Membership Section 7 Specialty Sections Section 8 Payment of Dues

- SECTION 7. SPECIALTY SECTIONS
 - a. Specialty Sections representing particular areas of interest within respiratory care shall be made available to Active, Associate, and Special Members of the Association. The purpose, organization and responsibilities of Specialty Sections shall be defined in the policies and procedures of the Association. A seat on the Board of Directors will be granted to those Specialty Sections with a minimum of 1000 Active, Associate, and/or Special Members, limited to six seats total as defined in the policies and procedures of the Association.

SECTION 8. PAYMENT OF DUES

Each member of the Association, except Life Members, Honorary Members, BOMA Members, and Active Duty Military shall pay dues in such amounts and in such manner as may be established annually by the Board of Directors.

Article V - Board of Directors Section 1.a Composition & Powers

The executive government of the Association shall be vested in a board of no more than eighteen (18) Active Members consisting of at least five (5) Officers, and twelve (12) Directors-at-Large and/ or Section Chairs serving as a Director from the top six Specialty Sections with a minimum of 1000 Active, Associate, and/or Special Members of the Association. So as long as the number of Section Chairs serving as Directors is at least six (6), the number of at-Large Directors-at-Large shall be equal to the number of Section Chairs serving as Directors. If the number of Sections Chairs serving as Directors is less than six (6), the number of Directors at-Large shall be increased to assure a minimum of twelve (12) Directors on the Board of Directors. The Immediate Past Speaker of the House of Delegates, the Chair of the President's Council and the Chair of the Board of Medical Advisors shall serve as full members of the board with voice but not vote. Directors shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of Article XII, Section 2 (b).

Article VII House of Delegates Section 3.c. 1-5 Duties

- The House of Delegates shall adopt such rules, regulations, policies, and procedures with respect to the House of Delegates as it may deem necessary or appropriate, and all Delegates shall be bound thereby.
- b. The House of Delegates Speaker may appoint members to the House of Delegates Committees. In the event of vacancies occurring in any House of Delegates Committee, the Speaker may appoint members to fill such vacancies.

A representative from each Delegation shall:

- 1. Attend all-meetings of the House of Delegates and report the activities to the respective Chartered Affiliate.
- 2. Attend the Annual Business Meeting of the Association as the representative of the Active Members of the Association within their respective Chartered Affiliate.
- 3. Furnish the Elections Committee with the names of qualified members for nomination as Directors-at-Large.
- Present proposed amendments to the Bylaws Committee at the direction of their respective Chartered Affiliate
- 5. Perform such other duties of office as may be necessary or required.

Article X - Chartered Affiliates Section 1. Requirements Section 3. Medical Advisor

- Section 1: Twenty (20) or more Active Members in good standing of the Association meeting the requirements for affiliation, including geographic boundaries for employment and/or residency
- Section 3: SECTION 3. MEDICAL ADVISOR
- Each Chartered Affiliate may have one (1) or more medical advisors whose name(s) shall be submitted to the Board of Medical Advisors

Article XII- Committees Section 2.a.1. & 2.b.1

- Bylaws and Elections Committee: add
- Additionally, the Immediate past Chair of the Bylaws and Elections Committee shall remain on the Bylaws Committee for one additional year in a consultatory role, with voice but no vote.
